# SAVE THE DATE - SEPTEMBER 27-28, 2025 - MOON ON THE WATER WITH WENDY MOORE

The PAC will be hosting a two-day virtual class of "Moon on the Water" with Wendy Moore. Class will be held for 6 hours each day via Zoom. The finished size of this piece is 6" x 7". There is no pre-work.

The goals for this piece are to work at moving from one color to the next as seamlessly as possible utilizing both color and texture of stitches chosen. The sky threads will glint a little as the stars rise around the moon. Long interlocking stitches such as giant brick stitched horizontally and staggered giant Hungarian ground stitches as well as darning stitches that take advantage of the canvas color, will light up around the moon down to the horizon. The moon itself will appear to glow on its own with a softness expressed with Vineyard, Pepper Pot, and Planet Earth silks. The craters of the moon will be indicated using the Circular Bargello Twist motif in two sizes. Shifting between the two and placement of segments of the Twist motifs will give texture to the moon. Add in a little glint for extra focus. The water will reflect the colors of the sky using the softer Pepper Pot and Vineyard silk threads in darning patterns and oblique long stitches. The whole point to the design is to emphasize the reflection of the moon on the water. This will be accomplished using small shallow crescent stitches manipulated to be their flattest. These will be stitched in the exposed canvas left after completing the water stitching.

**Students to Provide**: 12" stretcher bars (2 pair), tacks or staples, frame or frame-weight, laying tool (mandatory), usual stitching supplies, light and magnification recommended. I also would recommend a light colored towel or napkin to place under your stitching to help count the dark canvas.

#### Students will pay separately for the materials kit, which will cost approximately \$135 and will contain:

12" x 12" 18ct Antique Blue mono canvas, Taped & line drawn

3-hole punched Instruction packet with enlarged charts

Master Photo

Threads: Various silks, metallics and over-dyed flosses & pearls

Thread drops for organization

Needles: 20T, 22T Small white lead pencil

# JANUARY 2025 MEETING-THAP CARDINAL WOOL FELT ORNAMENT by LIZ KISIELEWSKI

At the chapter meeting on January 22, 2025, Carol Hatton-Holmes will teach the recent Take Home a Project (ThaP) "Cardinal Wool Felt Ornament" designed by Liz Kisielewski.

This cute little stuffy was a Take Home a Project (ThaP) at the Spring 2024 Region Meeting, when the PAC celebrated our 60th Anniversary! Thoughts of the wonderful event will follow us as we stitch this ornament at the January 2025 meeting on January 22, 2025 at Paoli United Methodist Church. Both the bird and the branch are made from wool felt in shades of red, brown, black, green, and orange, and it is stitched using DMC floss. In addition, holly leaves are made of a single layer of felt and attached with 1/4" red buttons.

The anticipated kit fee is \$5. The kit will include: wool felt in 2 reds, brown, green, black, and orange; DMC floss in red, brown, and black; two 1/4" red buttons; 12" of cording or ribbon to hang the ornament; polyester stuffing; and complete instructions.

The student would need to supply their usual stitching kit, including a sharp pointed needle with a hole large enough for 3 strands of floss, and scissors for cutting felt and paper. A glue stick or small bottle of glue is helpful in place of using pins to attach parts. A toothpick or other tool for stuffing the bird and the branch would also be very helpful.



# FEBRUARY 2025 MEETING - ANNUAL SATURDAY STITCH-IN - GETTING TO THE FINISH!

Our Annual Saturday Stitch-In will be held on Saturday, February 15, 2025, from 11:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. at Gerty Romer-Harts' home. This will be the chapter meeting for February 2025. The meeting will be dedicated to finishing. Whether it's completing the Cardinal Ornament, or the Valentine Biscornu, or some other project, this is the meeting where you can finish it so that it can finally be displayed or given as a gift! ### MARCH 2025 MEETING – BUMBLE BEE NEEDLE MINDER

Let's dip a little into Japanese bead embroidery! You may have seen and loved the intricate beaded purses and accessories in this technique. This is done by starting with a printed fabric, and stitching beads onto the surface following the print. This is a tiny piece to try; the bee is printed on the fabric, and we will follow that print to lay different beads on the surface. It's fun! Afterwards, we will mount the piece on a covered button form, snap it onto the back with some magnets, and VOILA, we will have a needle minder! Kits will be \$10 and will include all needed materials to complete the needle minder:

- 3" hoop
- Printed fabric
- Button form with magnets
- Beads
- threads

#### You will need to bring:

- Embroidery scissors
- a bead mat
- some beading needles
- Fabric scissors
