I am sure I can speak for most when I say that this has been the strangest year. I, for one, have missed stitching with everyone, and hugs. I really miss hugs! Finally I was able to see my granddaughters and got a few hugs. I will say, though, Zoom has been a godsend. It has been so nice to at least see each other and the projects that you have been working on or finished. If you have not joined us during one of our weekly Wednesday get-togethers on Zoom, give it a try. I will let you know when we can get back to our regular meetings at St. Luke.

I have some exciting news! The Royal School of Needlework is building a Stitch Bank to collate all the stitches in the world and put them online for all to use. Wow! Did you know that the chain stitch has been used for at least 3,000 years? The RSN is starting with the first 500 stitches and hopes to have it funded and available in 2020. A donation allows you to adopt a stitch in your name. The PAC Board voted to make a donation in order to adopt a stitch for our chapter. It is in the works, but we won't know which will be "our" stitch name until we receive our certificate. We continue with plans for our year at full steam ahead. In August, we will be gathering information on your projects to be included in our display at Ludington Library in November. At that exhibit, we will have 8 display cases and are asking for holiday-related stitchery but also for items from EGA meetings, classes or conventions. We will not have space this time for hanging pieces. Any questions, give me a call. We would love for everyone to display items! In September, we will again be making fleece blankets for our service project. The shelter is also in need of socks, so we have decided to include socks in our outreach. Pick up a bag of white tube socks when you are shopping! Keep November 14 open for our annual luncheon, with some changes this year. December is the Holiday Party with the President's Challenge – I'm challenging you to use something from nature to make a stitched "something".

After all that information, I am asking your help in planning future projects. What would you like to learn or improve upon or just do? I would love to hear your thoughts. Hope to see you all soon.

REGION REPRESENTATIVES REPORT – GERTY & DIANE

A meeting of the MAR's board and chapter representatives was held using Zoom on Saturday, May 3, 2020. Your Region Representatives thought the meeting was exceptionally well-organized.

The MAR 2020 Seminar "Get Stitching Gettysburg" has been postponed to May 14-16, 2021, in the same location in Gettysburg. Fortunately, if you registered for the seminar in 2020, you will be able to take the same classes in 2021. The Region has totebags available intended for the seminar. The cost is \$20.00. See the Region newsletter for how to order.

SMART day is scheduled for October 17, 2020 at DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel Wilmington, 4727 Concord Pike, Wilmington, Delaware and will be hosted by the Brandywine Chapter. The class for SMART Day will be "Flower Cuff" taught by Orna Willis. www.adornbyorna.com. The kit includes everything that is needed to complete the cuff: 7 skeins of yarn, Ultrasuede backing, bead pack, canvas, tapestry & quilting needles, copper wire, and the instruction booklet. The cuff is 7.5 "x 2.25" but this piece could also be added to a blouse, jacket, small bag, or made into another item. The six-hour class will accommodate up to 50 students. Kit Fee is \$60. Please send your coupon in by August 15, 2020 to reserve your place (available in the recent MAR newsletter.) There is also a coupon in the MAR newsletter for lunch, a "Build your Own Taco." If we are not able to meet together on October 17, 2020, the class will be taught virtually.

The Region is looking for chapters to host its meetings beginning with the fall of 2021 through the spring of 2023. There is no real cost to the chapter, and the region event planner helps to find the venue, etc. It is primarily a commitment of time and people in order to welcome attendees to the area and provide directions to restaurants, etc. A MAR seminar is scheduled to be held in 2022 in Norfolk, Virginia.

Money continues to be available to MAR members through the Joan Masterson and PRIDE scholarships.

EDUCATION REPORT – PATTY SMITH GARDNER

The new GCC Fandango is a Go-Go! I am pleased to announce that our latest Group Correspondence Course has gotten up to 13 members, and we can register as a chapter! This is great news, as our chapter will pay for the registration fee. Individual members will only pay for the text (\$45) and their materials. We have room for just 7 more chapter members to join in, so give it some thought.



We will start up with this project in October 2020, which will give us time to get the supplies and for National to get our paperwork organized. The first meeting will be where you get your text, and we compare notes on materials and read thru the course together and then get started! We will have regular get-togethers each month or so to keep everyone moving and talking. I will need to send a full class participant list with registration, so please email me at (~~scrubbed~~) before July 31, 2020 to let me know that you want to join us!

Here is more information about the course:

Join teacher Barbara Kershaw in Fandango, a Group Correspondence Course focused on Punto Antico, one of many beautiful styles of Italian whitework embroidery. Punto Antico embroidery includes a lot of satin stitch, Palestrina and bullion knots, curls and scrolls. Italian hemstitch is also an integral part of any design, as well as drawn thread areas with sometime simple and may times intricate needlewoven insertions. No matter if simple or intricate, it is a beautiful form of whitework. The design was created as a pillow band but instructions for an alternate end to create the runner are included in the text.

Size: Approximately 11" x 27" table runner; Pillow band is 13" x 19"

Design area: 864 x 372 threads

Skill level: Intermediate-Advanced

Prerequisites: Knowledge of drawn thread and needleweaving would be helpful

Length of class: 6 lessons in 8 months

Supplies used: Belfast linen, DMC® #8 and #12 Coton Perlé

Finishing supplies: Pillow fabric, Pillow form or bag of fiberfill

Text price: \$45.00. Left-handed instructions available on request.

Estimated supply cost: \$50.00, finishing supply cost approximately \$40.00

DMC Floss Number for tassel: DMC® #791

JULY MEETING – CHRISTMAS IN JULY ORNAMENT (THaP)

Gerty will teach this beginner level counted thread project, and you can use materials from your stash! This project was originally taught as a THaP at a 2019 MAR meeting by AliceRae Kutish. The base is an 18ct evenweave 100% cotton fabric (5x9-inches needed) and stitching is done with 2 colors of Perle Cotton #8 and a size 24 tapestry needle. The ornament is quick and simple, and can be altered in many ways to personalize it. Surprise your friends and family this year with a beautiful hand-stitched ornament!



Five different techniques will be taught:

- a cross stitch base will be embellished to create petals
- four-sided stitches will be used to create a border
- the back and front of the ornament will be connected with whip stitches
- a new way to make a tassel
- a hanging loop is made from twisted cord.

Stitchers will need their usual stitching supplies, as well as lighting and magnification, if needed. If you would like Gerty to put together a kit of needed materials for you, please contact her at **(scrubbed)**. The cost is \$6 if you wish to purchase a kit rather than use your own materials.

AUGUST MEETING – PLANNING FOR LUDINGTON

The PAC's 2018 exhibit in the display cases at Ludington Library in Bryn Mawr was such a success that we're going to do it again this November! The library has eight display cases in the entrance hall where we will display our work from November 2, 2020 to December 4, 2020. The library has very strict guidelines about how items can be displayed in the cases, and we're going to try planning the layouts of the exhibits in advance this time rather than trying to do it on the fly while setting up the exhibits. If you have any small easels, plate holders, unframed mirrors, stands/pedestals, etc. that you would like to loan the chapter for the exhibit, please let us know! We'll also be making labels for the items with the stitchers' names and information about the items.

At the chapter meeting on August 26, 2020, we will be planning the displays. At that time, we will be making a list of what everyone plans to display in order to get an idea of the space we need for each item, the layouts, etc. We are asking for fall and winter holiday-related stitchery but also for items from past EGA meetings, classes or conventions. Unfortunately, we will not have space this time for hanging pieces. We would love for everyone to display items!

Again, this display requires an EGA National form, Individual Appraisal of Fine Arts for Chapter or Regional Exhibits or Shows, filled out by each of us for what you plan to exhibit. Cinda will be collecting these forms at the August meeting or in November at the latest. You can print and fill this out at home, but Cinda will have extra copies at the August meeting. In 2019, the chapter will again be working to provide fleece blankets for those in need through The Good Samaritan Shelter in Phoenixville. This time, we will also be collecting tube socks, which the shelter indicated that the residents also need.
