WEEKLY WEDNESDAY GET-TOGETHERS VIA ZOOM-



ROYAL SCHOOL OF NEEDLEWORK NEWS!

The Royal School of Needlework began building a Stitch Bank in 2020 to collate all the stitches in the world and put them online for all to use. There are currently 225 stitches in the Stitch Bank, and each stitch includes information about the history of stitch and step-by-step instructions for the stitch, with photographs, illustrations, and a video! The PAC Board voted in 2020 to make a donation to adopt a stitch for our chapter. It took some time, but we have now received our official certificate, and we are the proud owners of the Loop Stitch! JULY & AUGUST MEETINGS - AZTEC SCISSORS CASE

In 2021, the EGA Stitch-a-Long Facebook page did a neat project called Aztec Scissor Case. PAC member Liz Gilbert thought it looked so neat that she decided to do it, and it turned out to be a really fun project! It's pretty simple and quick to stitch. And even finishing isn't that bad (for those of you who are serial non-finishers like Liz)! The plan is to begin work on the stitching at the July meeting, then go over finishing at the August meeting. The EGA SAL did it in 3 parts – you'll need to download the PDF from each of those posts:

The colors used on the SAL were the official EGA colors, but it's fairly easy to choose your own colors. Here's the list of supplies that you will need for the entire project:

- 18-ct mono canvas cut to 6" x 12"
- 1 ball #8 perle cotton for the border
- 4 skeins of #8 perle cotton for the stitching (in 4 different colors)
 NOTE: The PDF recommends #5 perle cotton, but Liz recommends using #8 as she found the #5 frayed extremely easily on this size of canvas
- 1 ball #12 perle cotton to match the canvas
- Ultrasuede for finishing (approx. 3"x4")
- Sewing thread for tacking the ultrasuede
- 6" and 12" stretcher bars with tacks
- Size 24-ish needle
- Optional: something to hold down Ultrasuede while stitching (recommended Clover clips)

For the initials on side 2, Liz created a pattern file that she can modify for any initials. Let her know if you'd like her to work up a pattern for you!





SEPTEMBER MEETING - OUTREACH IN FLEECE & SOCKS

The PAC will again be providing fleece blankets for those in need. Please purchase approximately 2 yards of polar fleece material (solids and patterns suitable primarily for teenagers and adults, please) for each blanket as a donation to this worthwhile cause. We will also be collecting new adult-size white tube socks for shelter residents. Further details to follow regarding the identity of this year's designated charity.

OCTOBER MEETING - PLUSHWORK POINSETTIA ORNAMENT

Who wants to try something completely new? This interesting technique is called Plushwork, also German Tufted Wool Embroidery, or Amish Stumpwork!

In the late 19th Century, thrifty homemakers would use salvaged yarn from knitted garments and scraps of wool to create multicolored stars or flowerlike designs. The wool was stitched around a tin template and used to create a pincushion or decorative pillow.

This is a fun way to play with the wool we were gifted a while ago! Patty will be making up kits from the wool and some purchased fabrics. This will keep the cost of the kits very low!
