IN THE NEWS -

The EGA Facebook Stitch-Along (SAL) page now has 6,173 members and continues to grow!. Check it out! Many of the projects have been the freebies available on the EGA website or in NeedleArts Magazine. This is another great way to stay connected!

There has been a lot in the news lately about high demand for items and supply chain issues. These issues have also impacted needlework supplies. Supply times are reported to be up to one year or longer for some fabrics and threads. Some items are not currently being manufactured in all colors and in all sizes, and other items have been prematurely discontinued by manufacturers. In addition, retailers are finding the paperwork and time needed to keep up with backorders so burdensome that they have stopped placing orders for the time-being. Try to find a suitable substitute at retail or among your stash for your project. Check with your stitching friends, too! They may have something that you can use. If you know that you will need particular supplies for a special project in the future, order now to give your retailer ample time to fulfill your order.

A new website called Diversity in Stitching will be launching soon to promote and support stitchers, Flosstubers, needlework shop owners, designers, fiber dyers, and other creative people who belong to communities that have historically been marginalized. Stitchers who identify as BIPOC, LGBTQIA+, neurodivergent, and/or living with a disability, or have been marginalized because of their religion, are welcome to register. In the context of this project, BIPOC includes individuals who identify as Black, Indigenous, Asian, Pacific Islander, Latinx, mixed race, and/or those who have experienced discrimination as a result of their race or ethnicity, and neurodivergent encompasses autism, dyslexia, dyspraxia, and ADHD. REGION REPRESENTATIVES REPORT – DIANE BISHOP

The Mid-Atlantic Region meeting was held on March 25, 2022. Diane attended the meeting and reported that it is a common misunderstanding that EGA chapters are required to do outreach in order to maintain their non-profit status, but this is not true! Outreach is all about making EGA known to the community in which we live. There was a lot of discussion about Outreach and how to achieve this. Public stitch-ins work, and there were suggestions about having something framed to sit on the table at the stitch-in. It was also reported that collage posters with stitched pieces attract a lot of attention. Anyone willing to work on this, please contact a PAC Board member.

The MAR GCC, Papillon by Adrienne Meyer fillet embroidery, was cancelled because not enough people signed up to participate.

Please check the MAR website (www.marega.org) for **teachers who are available to teach via Zoom** and let a PAC Board member know if you are interested in a particular teacher/class. The MAR website also now has the Royal School of Needlework stitch bank. There is also information there about MAR scholarships, which are underutilized.

The 2022 **Region Seminar "Waves of Stitches"** will take place on June 16-20, 2022 in Virginia Beach, Virginia. The number of teachers was reduced to 8 because the seminar received less than half of the anticipated registrants. The seminar hotel has refrigerators in each room and microwaves are available upon request.

The EGA Seminar 2022 Broadway Bound will take place on August 24-28, 2022 in NYC.

Camp Wannastitch will be held next year from January 12-16, 2023 in Ocean City, Maryland. Mark your calendars! Sadly, the Clarion Fontainebleu has been sold. The Camp Wannastitch committee has been in talks with the new owners and also visiting other hotels in Ocean City so that Camp Wannastitch will happen. Look for updates to be announced in the near future.

The **MAR Nominating committee is still looking for a new MAR Region Director** to replace Donna Pence when her term ends.

The **next MAR Board Meeting** will be held in person on September 17, 2022, hosted by the Colonial West Jersey Chapter, with a THaP, Nature's Palette by Catherine Jordan, in which she teaches how to embroider a magnolia leaf. See the coupon in the Winter Issue of the MAR Newsletter.

The PAC has volunteered to host the Spring 2024 MAR Region Meeting. Please consider volunteering to coordinate this effort. Once the hotel is selected (last time we hosted a meeting, we used the Sheraton in Frazer), the MAR takes care of the details. We need someone to make a list of area restaurants and also decide/coordinate any welcome details that we wish to provide to attendees. There is no THAP involved in this meeting.

APRIL MEETING – A SPRING SAMPLER PART 2 BY MELITA GLAVIN

We continued stitching Melita Glavin's A Spring Sampler, at our April meeting. Melita Glavin gave a presentation on substituting colorways in A Spring Sampler at our November 2021 meeting. The sampler uses different stitches in each of the 21 bands. The stitch colors are chosen around a single overdyed Waterlilies. Other threads include Silk Lamé Braid Petite, Planet Earth Silk 6-ply, Bijoux, Gloriana, Soie Perlee, Splendor, Silk Lamé Braid for 18 count, Pepper Pot Silk, and Neon Rays.



The design size is 12 X 9" and the canvas size is 16" X 13" on 18 count canvas.

MAY MEETING - ALL-DAY STITCH-IN OVERDYED SPOOLS THAP BY MELITA GLAVIN

Gerty Romer-Harts has graciously offered to teach Overdyed Spools by Melita Glavin at an all-day stitch-in at her home on May 25, 2022. This project was taught as a Take Home a Project (THAP) at the MAR Region fall 2021 meeting. You will explore 4 canvas stitches using 1 overdyed thread to learn how to control the visible color of the thread.

For this project, you will need:

- 18ct mono canvas, cut to 10"x8"
- 1 full skein Caron Watercolors with at least 3 distinct colors
- any medium-to-dark brown thread for the wooden spools
- (2) 10" & (2) 8" stretcher bars
- Assorted stash threads to coordinate with your chosen Watercolors
- usual stitching supplies
- instructions provided by Gerty as a PDF (6 pages)



JUNE MEETING – SILK RIBBON STITCHING FISH, ANEMONES & FLOATERS BY LISA MCGINNIS

This silk ribbon project is an original design by PAC member Lisa McGinnis. Lisa will provide you with the instructions and tracing outline. A kit containing the silk ribbon can be requested, or you can use any silk ribbon supplies that you have.

The fish bodies are padded with perle cotton, then stitched with straight stitches of silk ribbon. The fins and anemone stems are straight stitched with silk ribbon. The anemone tops are stitched with satin stitches while twisting the ribbon or small curls of layered split stiches. Five-petal lazy daisies float around the fish. This simple silk ribbon project can be small, one fish and two anemones, or large, two fish and three anemones. The small can be stitched using a 6" hoop and the large can be stitched in an 8" hoop.

Fabric, ribbon, threads and beads (for the eyes) will be supplied in a kit, if requested. The fish can be yellow, orange or light red, and you can request your preference. Kits are available in 2 sizes. A small kit is \$8 and contains the supplies for one fish and two anemones. A large kit is \$12 and contains the supplies for two fish and three anemones. Please state your preference of kit size and fish color when contacting Lisa. A supply list will be provided if you are using your own supplies. Let Lisa know your preference by May 27, 2022.

For the class, you will need either a 6" hoop if stitching the small kit or an 8" hoop if stitching the large kit. You will also need Chenille (sharp) needs in sizes 18, 20 and 22, and a size 10 beading needle for the eye.

Kits will be supplied at the meeting. If you will be Zooming the June meeting, let Lisa know so the kit can be mailed or picked up in advance of the meeting.



JULY & AUGUST MEETINGS - AZTEC SCISSORS CASE

In 2021, the EGA Stitch-a-Long Facebook page did a neat project called Aztec Scissor Case. PAC member Liz Gilbert thought it looked so neat that she decided to do it, and it turned out to be a really fun project! It's pretty simple and quick to stitch. And even finishing isn't that bad (for those of you who are serial non-finishers like Liz)! The plan is to begin work on the stitching at the July meetying, then go over finishing at the August meeting. The EGA SAL did it in 3 parts – you'll need to download the PDF from each of those posts:



The colors used on the SAL were the official EGA colors, but it's fairly easy to choose your own colors. Here's the list of supplies that you will need for the entire project:

- 18-ct mono canvas cut to 6" x 12"
- 1 ball #8 perle cotton for the border
- 4 skeins of #8 perle cotton for the stitching (in 4 different colors)
 NOTE: The PDF recommends #5 perle cotton, but Liz recommends using #8 as she found the #5 frayed extremely easily on this size of canvas
- 1 ball #12 perle cotton to match the canvas
- Ultrasuede for finishing (approx. 3"x4")
- Sewing thread for tacking the ultrasuede
- 6" and 12" stretcher bars with tacks
- Size 24-ish needle
- Optional: something to hold down Ultrasuede while stitching (recommended Clover clips)

For the initials on side 2, Liz created a pattern file that she can modify for any initials. Let her know if you'd like her to work up a pattern for you!
